- Coastal tools and services to support local decision makers




Post-Sandy Response: Navigation Response Teams & All-Hazards Response





PL 113-2:

\$326M for NOAA

NOS funding includes:


- \$50M for mapping, charting, geodesy, and marine debris services
- \$3M for Coastal Impact Assistance
- \$7M to repair/replace PORTS, NWLON, and IOOS sensors
- Funding for NOS facility repair


NOS Highlights:

- Hydro surveys for chart updates, inundation modeling, and marine debris
- Shoreline surveys using bathymetric/topographic LIDAR
- Vertical datum updates in Sandy-affected areas
