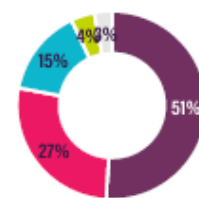

INCREASING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

A primary Phase II objective is to deliver consistent outcomes across a variety of school communities, especially within the key student indicators highlighted below. Based on a full set of data from district transfers following the 21-22 school year, 95%+ of 3DE schools outperform prior year metrics and/or non-3DE comparative cohorts in key student engagement and achievement metrics of Attendance, Academic Proficiency, Graduation Rates, and Post-Secondary Enrollment. Metrics below representative of SY2021-2022 year-end results, averaged across 3DE schools.

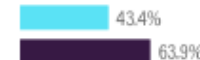
