Healthy Democracy Healthy People

<u>Healthy Democracy Healthy People</u> (HDHP) is a nonpartisan coalition of major public health and civic engagement organizations. Its overall aim is strengthening our collective capacity to realize health and racial equity by advancing an inclusive healthy democracy that promotes civic and voter participation.

Health and Democracy Index: When communities vote they influence policy decisions that have a big effect on their health. This analysis compares 12 public health indicators and voter turnout to the restrictiveness of voting policies in each state.
