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VA Role in the Millennium Cohort Study

- The study was designed with the plan to follow-up participants using VA health care data after separation from the military
 - VA can provide objectively measured health outcomes and other information in addition to survey self-report
- Original IRB application included the plan to share data. This was approved.





Approval was received from both DoD and VA in late 2018

Bilateral Millennium Cohort participant data sharing between these two agencies









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




Capturing VA Utilization

 Of the 147,190 Millennium Cohort Study participants who have separated from military service, approximately 92% (135,781) have registered in a VA facility











Millennium Cohort Study -VA Outpatient Encounters










Millennium Cohort Study -VA Inpatient Discharges







How Often Do Millennium Cohort Participants Newly Enroll in VA?

- New VHA enrollment, March 2020 to March 2021
 - -N = 2,639
- 51 per week



Medical Encounter Data

- Military Health System Data Repository (MDR)
 - Active duty service members and activated reservists
 - Inpatient and outpatient ICD-9, ICD-10, CPT codes, etc.
 - All care paid for by TRICARE, both at military treatment and private facilities
- Veterans Health Administration
 - Data Use Agreement established in 2018

- Performed February 2020
- AHOBR finder file, n(rows)=193,993
- Valid unique SSN =193,962, (excludes 2 duplicate SSNs and 29 missing SSNs from the finder file)

Mortality Data Sources

- Cause-specific deaths
 - National Death Index
 - Current and former service members
 - Source: Defense Suicide Prevention Office
 - Armed Forces Medical Examiner System
 - Active duty and activated Reserve/National Guard
 - Includes deaths occurring OCONUS
 - Source: Armed Forces Health Surveillance Board
- Vital Status
 - Social Security Administration Death Master File
 - Veterans Affairs Death Files





What VA-DoD Data Sharing Will Accomplish

- VA data will be matched to Millennium Cohort Study participants including information on:
 - Service-connected conditions
 - Pharmacy prescription fills
 - Laboratory results
 - Other diagnostic and illness severity information
- Sharing will enable much better assessment of these outcomes in relation to military service





Impact of DoD/VA Data Sharing

- Improve ability to validate survey information obtained from Millennium Cohort Study using objective VA data
- Expand the types of health outcomes we can identify in relation to military service beyond what is available in the Millennium Cohort survey that is conducted every 3-5 years
- Enhance the ability of Millennium Cohort Study to assess long-term health effects of military service

Future Plans and Possibilities

- Millennium Cohort is planned to continue until 2068 – no end state in the foreseeable future
- Biomarkers
 - MVP
 - Shield (for COVID)
- Remote collection (Saliva, TASSO system)
- Linkage with cancer registries
- Consider collaborations with other research under planning or development
