



How Reporters Think Our Postings Help Them in Their Work




Health/Medical Science Journalist Survey What Health/Medical Science Reporters Say are the Triggers to their Stories

Health/Medical Science Journalist Survey Obstacles to accurate reporting on health/medical science issues



What's the Biggest Obstacle to Accurate Reporting about Science?

KNOWLEDGE PROBLEM:

It's not that journalists don't know something, it's that they don't know enough.

Not simply getting "the facts right" but asking the right questions, framing the story properly, and recognizing the second- and third-order story possibilities

EDUCATION PROBLEM:

It's not that journalists aren't interested in research, it's that they lack research literacy (and tend to think it's somewhat easy to acquire).
