Ocean Decade: U.S. Launch Meeting, February 3 and 4, 2021

From 2021-2030, the UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development will focus scientific initiatives across the globe on the science needed to ensure sustainable use of ocean resources and long-term ocean health. The U.S. National Committee for the Decade will encourage participation and serve as a communication channel for the U.S. ocean science community throughout this international effort.

This meeting is designed to foster engagement, dialogue and ideation around transformative research efforts in support of the Decade as outlined in the UN Ocean Decade Implementation Plan (available at: oceandecade.org). The U.S. National Committee issued a call for transformative concepts – Oceanshots – that address the challenges identified in the Implementation Plan. The submissions from that call are featured in the Oceanshot Plenary Sessions, Ocean Poster Hall, and will be discussed in the Concurrent Sessions organized by challenge themes.
