



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

## 5. Consequences: Mexico

Compared to civilian law enforcement, Mexico's constabularization has led to:

#### Higher levels of violence

Homicides (+17/100,000) Kidnappings (+ 1/100,000)

#### More Human Rights abuses


160-250% more complaints during first two years

#### Police Reform

Diversion of attention, resources, talent



Figure 1 Homicide and Kidnapping Rates, Average Militarized States vs. Synthetic Control





- Militarization of police vs. constabularization of the military

Non-random assignment

### 7. Stakes

- "Mano dura" approaches -> criminalization of poverty

- High correlation between income and race/ethnicity

- Addressing crime vs violence

- Crucial deficit in quality of democracy
