- Department of Transportation (DOT) Activities
  - FY 2022 President's Budget, includes \$621 billion for transportation & resilience investments from American Jobs Plan, highlights:
    - \$2.9 billion in Building a Better America DOT Major Grant Programs
      - The INFRA (Infrastructure for Rebuilding America) Grants Program
      - The Mega Grant Program
      - The Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program
      - Single streamlined Application Process for all three grant programs
    - \$1 billion for the <u>Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity</u>
       (<u>RAISE</u>) <u>grants</u> formerly known as TIGER/BUILD Grants (<u>How to Apply</u>)
    - \$110 million for a new Thriving Communities program to help communities eliminate transportation barriers and increase access to jobs, schools and businesses.
    - \$1.2 billion for the Maritime Administration, including:
      - \$230 million for the <u>Port Infrastructure Development Program</u>
      - \$316 million for a 5th National Security Multi-Mission Vessel (NSMV) to replace
         California Maritime Academy (CMA) Training Ship (T.S.)



- Department of Transportation (DOT) Activities
  - Innovation: A hallmark of Secretary Buttigleg leadership of DOT
    - The Secretary's Innovation Principles:
      - serve our policy priorities
      - help America win the 21st century
      - support workers
      - allow for experimentation and learn from failure
      - provide opportunities to collaborate
      - be flexible and adapt as technology changes

  - Freight Indicators: Bureau of Transportation Statistics has begun a weekly update and release of Freight Indicators
    - That includes port congestion inside and outside the Gate, freight movement, and transportation labor and capacity tightness
  - Non-Traditional & Emerging Transportation Technology (NETT) Council: Federal Register notice seeking public comment on projects, issues, or topics that DOT should consider through the NETT Council, closes on April 8 (NETTCouncil@dot.gov)

# MARAD Update Department of Transportation (DOT) Activities

- USDOT Research, Development and Technology Strategic Plan:
  - Update 5-year DOT RD&T Strategic Plan (2022-2026); comments (<u>rdtplan@dot.gov</u>)
- OST-R Funding Opportunities:
  - University Transportation Center (UTC) Grants; NOFO May 2022.
  - Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants;
     Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) in calendar year 2022
- Other Activities of Interest
  - Passenger Ferry Grant Program \$45.3 million administered by FTA for FY 2021, with projects in 11 states and territories.
  - Position, Navigation and Timing/Spectrum \$17 Million, 3-year money
  - DOT Supply Chain Assessment of the Transportation Industrial Base (Feb 2022)
  - Workforce Development and DEI is a priority for DOT/MARAD
  - CMTS Established a Mariner & MTS Workforce IAT to include working groups on:
    - Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI)
    - Military to Mariner (M2M)
    - Mariner Mental Health & Welfare
    - Recruitment & Retention
    - Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment (SASH)



#### MARAD Grant Programs

- \$450 Million NOFO for the <u>Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP)</u>
  - National Defense Authorization Act and Jobs Act (IIJA) for Fiscal Year 2022
  - Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
  - Applications due by COB May 16, 2022
  - 80% federal / 20% local cost share
  - No more than 25% of funds (\$112.5 million) can be awarded to one state
  - \$112.5 million set aside for small projects at small ports
- \$234 Million Notice of Funding Opportunity for the <u>Port Infrastructure</u> <u>Development Program (PIDP)</u>
  - Consolidated Appropriations Act 2022 signed by the President, March 15, 2022
  - For coastal seaports, inland river ports, or Great Lakes ports, with no less than \$209,310,000 going to coastal seaports or Great Lakes ports

- America's Marine Highway Program (AMHP)
  - \$25 Million Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
    - Applications due by 5:00 P.M. EDT on April 29, 2022
    - Information available in the Federal Register

- Maritime Environmental and Technical Assistance (META)
   Program
  - Foster research, development and demonstration of emerging technologies and processes to improve U.S. maritime industry environmental sustainability
  - New project award on microgrids in the works in response to RFP
  - Areas of interest include: Deep dive studies into regional decarbonization considerations for vessels and ports; RFPs forthcoming



#### MARAD CoE

- First 27 <u>Centers of Excellence Designations for Domestic Maritime Workforce</u>
   <u>Training and Education (CoE)</u>
  - The CoE designation recognizes community colleges and training institutions that prepare students for careers in the Nation's maritime industry, located in 16 states and 1 U.S. territory. Maybe funding opportunities under Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
- MARAD National Security Multi-Mission Vessels (NSMVs)
  - \$316 million in 2022 FY budget for a 5th NSMV for CMA T.S.
  - NSMV I, EMPIRE STATE contract delivery date is April 2023, with each subsequent vessel delivering 9 months after the previous one
  - Purpose
    - · Recapitalization of the Training Ship Fleet
    - Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Relief (HA/DR)
    - · Meeting the Five Transportation Priorities:
      - Safety
      - Transportation Equity
      - Climate Change Initiative
      - Transformational Investment
      - Job Creation



### MARAD NSMVs [CONT.]

- Principle Dimensions
  - Length 160.05 m (525'- 1")
  - Beam 27.0 m (88'- 7")
  - Depth 16.8 m (55'- 1.5")
  - Design Draft 6.5 m (21'- 4")

#### Accommodation

- Training Ship Mode 600 cadets, 100 officers crew, faculty and staff
- Propulsion, Speed & Consumption
  - Diesel electric with four main engines 16,800 kW plus 900 kW Emergency Generator

- Nuclear Ship SAVANNAH (NSS) Decommissioning & License Termination (DECON-LT)
- NSS Overview
  - Launched 1959 by MARAD Department of Commerce as part of Atoms for Peace program.
  - All nuclear fuel removed 1971; only reactor and components remaining onboard.
  - Designated a National Historic Landmark in 1991.
  - Currently berthed in Baltimore, MD.
  - MARAD holds a Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) issued license.
  - Decommissioning must be completed no later than December 2031, per the NRC license requirements (60 years after defueling).
  - Congress provided \$131M in funding to MARAD for decommissioning.



- Nuclear Ship SAVANNAH (N.S. SAVANNAH)
   Decommissioning & License Termination (DECON-LT) [CONT.]
- What needs to be done to the SAVANNAH?
  - In accordance with tightly regulated NRC requirements, remaining systems, structures and components associated with the nuclear power plant will be removed, including:
    - Reactor Pressure Vessel
    - Control Rod Drive System
    - Neutron Shield Tank
    - Steam Generators
    - Pressurizer
    - Primary System piping, valves, etc.
    - Outlying equipment and piping
  - Once removed, these items will be properly packaged and transported to a licensed, low-level waste disposal site within the United States.

- Technology Opportunities
  - Discussion of a possible Maritime Safety Reporting Pilot Project
  - Green Energy/GHG Reductions
    - Fuel Cell/Micro Reactors/Electrification
    - Hydrogen/Green Energy productions
    - Offshore Wind, and supporting industries
  - Workforce Development
    - Every Mariner Builds A Respectful Culture (EMBARC)/Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment (SASH)
    - Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI)
    - Traditional/Non-Traditional, I.E. MARAD CoE's
  - Comprehensive Regulation Reform
    - Automation/Autonomous Technologies
    - Manning Requirements
    - Energies/Efficiently
      - Alternative fuels (hydrogen, methanal, ammonia, bio-fuels)
      - Alternative technologies (fuel cell, batteries, hybrid, micro reactors)
