Rooted in Trust

What:

 Global pandemic information response program addressing the unprecedented spread of health related rumors and misinformation



How:

- Community driven rumor tracking and social listening
- Two-way dialogue between humanitarian, media, health, and community actors
 - Content/information that is localized, contextualized, factual, and responding to community needs





Where:

Colombia, Brazil, Haiti, Sudan, South Sudan, Mali, Zimbabwe, DRC, Madagascar, Afghanistan, Iraq, Lebanon, Central African Republic, and Yemen


Why:

To promote resilient and better prepared information ecosystems for at-risk communities

Why Information Ecosystem Preparedness?

- The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated that the state of an information ecosystem greatly influences the effectiveness of response
- From Why Information Matters 2015: "healthy information ecosystems promote resilience, while weak information ecosystems seriously hinder preparedness"

The Knowledge GAP?

- It is important to understand what information ecosystem preparedness means for the different actors, and what are the challenges and strategies for its implementation
- Limited research on this regard



Research: Hypothesis

- Goal: Real dialogue and exchange of information amongst IE stakeholders
- Purpose: Science-based information (from health agencies) is combined with the latest, contextual knowledge (from CSO/Community engagement) and discussed via 2-way communication through channels and platforms that communities have access to and are likely to use (through local media, CSOs).
- How: Building and maintaining those networks/relationships
- Why: improve coordination to avoid that ill-timed, ill-informed communication further alienates the affected population.
