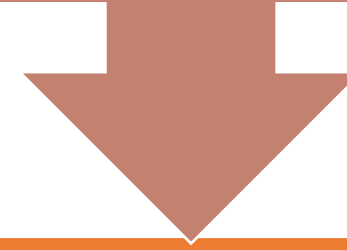

## **Recovery Needs Level®**

The Recovery Needs Level assigns the right level of service intensity for an individual at the right time.



## **Recovery Marker Inventory®**

The Recovery Markers Inventory is a clinician's rating of a person on eight objective factors associated with recovery.



## **Promoting Recovery in Organizations (PRO)**

The PRO Survey is completed by the individual in service to address staff's characteristics which promote recovery.



## **Consumer Recovery Measure**

The Consumer Recovery Measure is a subjective measure of changes in recovery completed by the person receiving services.

# Recovery Needs Level

*The RNL assigns the right level of service intensity at the right time. Individual's needs change over time in the journey to recovery.*

## Assertive Community Treatment

- 1:14 staff ratio, bachelor's level case manager helps person with basic needs. People also participate in group therapy, psychosocial rehabilitation, and psychiatry.

## Intensive Case Management

- 1:30 staff ratio, bachelor's level case manager helps person with basic needs. People also participate in group therapy, psychosocial rehabilitation, and psychiatry.

## Enhanced Outpatient

- 1:40 staff ratio. Masters' level therapist is paired with bachelor's level case manager. People also receive psychiatry services.

## Outpatient

- 1:80 staff ratio, licensed clinician and psychiatrist.

## Psychiatry-Only

- 1:250 care manager for paperwork; services limited to psychiatry.
