


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




Level-Setting: Terminology

Population Health Networks: Partnerships that work intentionally and systematically across sectors to achieve shared goals specific to improved health and wellness outcomes for an entire geographically-defined community

Population Health Integrators: Entities that have formally agreed to take leadership and accountability (alone or in concert with other network members) for specific integrative activities within a cross-sector network as a means of supporting the network's goals

Integrative Activities: Governance, oversight, and administrative activities that enable cross-sector networks to carry out tasks and strategies related to the network's population health goals



Timeline of Relevant Work

Near-Term, Lab-Related Goals

- Create a memorandum of understanding (MOU) that formalizes the partnership between Bridgeport Prospers (BP) and the Heath Improvement Alliance (HIA). BP will also work to ensure that its phase 2 efforts are planned with equity at the center of network activities
- Create two data sharing agreements: (a) Client-level data within the Baby Bundle health collaborative (client data sharing) and (b) Population-level data across the BP and HIA networks
- Use the Learning Lab's equity tools in conjunction with community consultants to ensure that the network's plans are being implemented through a community lens

Achievements Supported by Technical Assistance from the Learning Lab

- Consolidation of BP and the Bridgeport HIA under the umbrella of the Connecticut Health Enhancement Community (HEC); including data-sharing agreements and signed MOUs
- Refinement of Theory of Change for BP's "Baby Bundle" increased ability of partners to see their interdependence in improving infant/adolescent health and addressing social determinants of health for youth and families in Bridgeport
- Incorporated equity impact review assessment into the day-to-day operation of BP/HIA/HEC
- Incorporated tools and concepts from the Lab into applications for grants and awards
- Revised approach to collecting and analyzing
 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) data in partnership with community residents

Examples of Success

Network-Wide Equity Assessment in Guilford

Over the course of the Learning Lab, partners in Get Ready Guilford created a bold goal for ending health disparities for children and their families in their county. Network partners utilized equity tools from the Learning Lab to ensure that work on this goal, and all future efforts of Get Ready Guilford, are grounded in equity principles.

New Leadership in Flathead County

Over the course of the Learning Lab, leadership of the Maternal Mental Health Coalition transferred to a community-based organization that is better positioned to infuse the voice of people with lived experience of issues being addressed by the Coalition into the strategic direction of the network.

Examples of Success

Coalescing Around the Health Enhancement Community in Bridgeport

During the course of the Integrator Learning Lab, Bridgeport Prospers and the local Health Improvement Alliance combined their efforts (including signing formal data-sharing agreements) under the umbrella of the local Health Enhancement Community. This improved both networks' ability to track the impact they are having on eliminating health disparities for Bridgeport children and families.

Plan of Safe Care in Sarasota County

Over the course of their time in the Learning Lab, First 1,000 Days Sarasota became a lead organization in developing a Plan of Safe Care to ensure that children and families in the county have access to the resources and proven interventions they need to address any health and behavioral needs.


CARES Act Dollars in Paterson

Partners in Paterson utilized dollars from the federal CARES Act to support cross-sector work focused on housing as a social determinant of health for Paterson residents.

Case Study: Bridgeport Prospers Clarifying TA Priorities & Co-Creating a TA Action Plan (March 2020)

PRIORITIES

- Leadership/Engagement: Working to create an MOU that formalizes the partnership between BP and HIA. BP will also work to ensure that its phase 2 efforts are planned with equity at the center of network activities.
- Continuous Improvement: Creating two data sharing agreements: (a) Client-level data within the Baby Bundle health collaborative (client data sharing) and (b) Population-level data across the Prospers and HIA networks.
- Equity: BP is specifically interested in using the Learning Lab's equity tools in conjunction with community consultants to ensure that the network's plans are being implemented through a community lens.

TA RECEIVED

Two training and applied learning sessions from Visible Network Labs-

- 1) Network analysis to plan for brining two pre-existing networks together;
- 2) Mapping existing data silos and network connections needed to remove them.

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

The Five Tools:

- 1. Integrative Activities Inventory
- 2. Alignment
- 3. Network Values
- 4. Distributed Accountability
- 5. Being Present with Purpose

Take-Aways

- ✓ Being disciplined about creating dedicated time and space to consider integrative activities is the key.
- ✓ Start at the beginning—assess and align. Revisit regularly.
- ✓ Support for big ideas (community led, network supported goal-setting; health equity; value determination) is insufficient on its own. Use tools to operationalize big ideas and turn ideas into action.
- ✓ In addition to creating dedicated time and space, four elements were essential for success as population health integrators:
 - "Naming" integrator functions
 - "Claiming" integrator functions
 - Clarity on roles
 - Clear commitment to equity
