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Introduction

Manhattan Chinatown, NY - Between 2000 and 2010

- The area had seen losses in total population. The decreases in Asian population outpaced the decrease in total population.
- The decline in Asian population can be largely attributed to the loss in the child population, while the senior population remained relatively stable.
- The number of the Asian households also remained relatively stable when compared to the Asian population change.
- Examine potential impact on large minority population.

Introduction

Buffalo, NY - Between 2000 and 2010

- Total population decreased in Buffalo.
- Due to a sizable number of resettled refugees, some communities in Buffalo had experienced a significant increase in Asian population.
- Examine potential impact on small population with rapid growth analysis.
