





Phase 1	June 2018 – November 2018	3,000+	~450	~140	\$2,425,000
Phase 2	February 2020 – April 2021	26,000+	~4,000	~2,350	\$24,155,000



2021'22 Outreach Pilot



• Outcomes:

- 30% of applicants from DAC
- 69% conversion rate from application started to completed
- **–** 39 grantees
- 95 approved applicants currently car shopping






