2010 Self-Response Overview

- Paper was the primary way to collect data.
- Questionnaires were mailed to U.S. households.
- Used a mailing strategy consisting of multiple contacts. One change from the Census 2000 mailing strategy was the implementation of a replacement questionnaire. The multiple contacts in the 2010 Census included:
 - An advance letter alerting households that the census questionnaire will be sent to them soon.
 - The initial questionnaire.
 - A direct mail postcard to select areas.
 - An English-only replacement questionnaire distributed in one of three treatments:
 - Blanket Replacement Mailing
 - Targeted Replacement Mailing
 - No Replacement Mailing

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2020 Internet Self-Response

Goal

The goal of the Internet Self-Response (ISR) operation is to communicate the importance of responding to the 2020 Census to the U.S. population and generate the largest possible self-response in order to reduce the need to conduct expensive in-person follow-up.

Operation Purpose

- Develop communication and contact strategies to encourage the use of the internet as the primary response mode through a sequence of invitations and reminder mailings.
- 2. Increase high-quality responses by increasing the opportunity to and flexibility with which a person can respond.
- 3. Increase response to the census by working with other operations to provide the opportunity to respond using other collection modes.



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


2020 Census: Internet Self-Response Login Page

2020 Self-Response – COVID 19 Pandemic Changes

Every Door Direct Mail (EDDM) Postcard to Post Office Box Only Areas

- 4.5 million Post Office Boxes in areas where the physical addresses of housing units are not eligible for any form of United States Postal Service carrier delivery service
- 1.3 million of the 4.5 million Post Office Boxes are currently assigned to customers

Self-Response Sixth Mailing – Addressed Postcard

 Addressed postcard to the estimated 50 M nonresponding housing units as of mid-July; included a Census ID

Self-Response Seventh Mailing – Paper Questionnaire

- Additional paper questionnaire to about 16.2 million households in low-responding census tracts
- Targeted to nonresponding households that had received only one paper questionnaire in the mail



2020 Census: Summary of Self-Response

- Original Dates: March 12 July 31, 2020
- Adjusted Dates: March 12 October 15, 2020
- Final Self-Response Rate: ~67.0%
 - Exceeded Final 2010 Census Self-Response Rate of 66.5%
- Self-Response Rate by Mode:

•Internet: 53.5%

• Paper: 12.3%

• Phone: 1.2%



Early Takeaways from 2020 ISR

Self-response was a key component in achieving the goal of counting everyone "once, only once, and in the right place"

~93 M responses collected via ISR

- ~76 M ID responses, ~17 M non-ID responses
- ~4 M responses collected on April 1 (our peak day)
- Zero down time!



Direction Forward for 2030

- Collaborate with Non-ID Operation to improve the user experience of address data collection and standardization at the time of response
- Build on the success of ISR in 2020 by evaluating respondent behavior using Paradata to make additional improvements for 2030
