



Winn CDA — Key Program Elements

Winn CDA Award	• ESI Physicians: \$240K (\$120K/year for 2 years)
Training	 Community-Oriented Clinical Trialist (COCT) Training 4.5-day intensive Design and Implementation of Clinical Trials Workshop (led by the American Association for Cancer Research) 2-year Community-Oriented Clinical Trialist curriculum and training, featuring weekly or biweekly lectures by distinguished faculty
Career Development	 Individual Professional Development Planning Mentored career planning and tracking with an experienced Principal Investigator Community-Oriented Clinical Trialist Competency Self-Assessment
Mentoring	Tiered Mentoring Model Scholars mentored by Principal Investigators Scholars will mentor diverse medical students (Winn CIPP Students)
Capacity Building	Continued Career and Leadership Development Support Available to program graduates to support ongoing career and leadership development in clinical research



Community Outreach Clinical Trialist Training

Purpose:

To train a new generation of world class clinical trialists who possess the additional knowledge and competencies to foster active community engagement in clinical and translational research.

Components:

- → Design and Implementation of Clinical Trials Workshop (4^{1/2} days)
- → COCT Curriculum (2-yr)
 - → Scholars Forum
 - → Community Engagement Activities
 - → Capstone Project
 - → Annual Convenings
 - → Individual Professional Development Plans (IPDP)
 - → Mentoring
