DECIDING TO INCLUDE PALLIATIVE AND END OF LIFE CARE IN THE ESSENTIALS

- » 1998 Development of the Peaceful Death Competencies
- » Nurses are on the fore-front of caring for patients with serious illness/injury at the point of care.
- » These competencies provide direction for faculty in teaching this important material.
- » AACN had the vision and commitment to lead the way in developing these original competencies at the end of the 20th century, in an effort to reach the complex needs of seriously ill/injured patients in the 21st century.



WHY PRIMARY PALLIATIVE NURSING EDUCATION IS CRITICAL NOW




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- » 90% of hospitals (300 or more beds) in the U.S. have a palliative care program


