Robert Keohane's Final Comments Chairs' Discussion, December 2, 2020



What is the biggest recent advance in our knowledge of governance?

To be viable, strategies for sustainability must generate self-interested incentives for support by powerful coalitions, including coalitions within governments and firms, which requires both analysis of political-economic structures and of the path-dependent dynamics of complex systems.

What are the most important questions ripe for research? (1)

 1. Under what conditions can strategies for sustainable governance generate both desirable outcomes and robust political support?

• 2. How can innovations be nourished in protected niches yet be diffused enough to become systemically transformative?

What are the most important questions ripe for research (2)

 3. Under what conditions do politically viable near-term steps open greater opportunities for later action rather than creating path dependence that blocks desirable future options?

What do we know that has the clearest implications for action?

- 1) Success on complex issues requires focal points and institutions for concerted or complementary action, and leadership.
- 2) Leadership, and willingness to follow enlightened leadership, is essential at every level: local, national, transnational and international.
