# OVERVIEW

In collaboration with the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), the National Academies will hold a virtual workshop on the unique and valuable role the arts and humanities can play in medicine, medical education, and clinician wellbeing during the COVID-19 pandemic. The event will draw upon lessons learned from the 2018 National Academies study, *Branches from the Same Tree: The Integration of the Humanities and Arts with Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine in Higher Education* and the soon to be released AAMC report, *The Fundamental Role of the Arts and Humanities in Medical Education*. The event will feature a tapestry of activities and demonstrations that showcase current, integrative arts and humanities approaches to teaching and learning in medicine. The event will explore lessons from:

- history and literature about the impact of race and racism on health equity;
- the performing or visual arts on listening and communication; and
- the arts and humanities for self-reflection, meaning-making, and self-care.

Immediately following the virtual workshop, we will continue the discussion with a viewing of a new film, *Why Doctors Write: Finding Humanity in Medicine*. The 35-minute documentary is about the expanding movement in medicine to use writing, humanities, and the arts to support clinicians and trainees in dealing with the challenges of health care today.
