  - 51 Department of Veterans Affairs medical centers

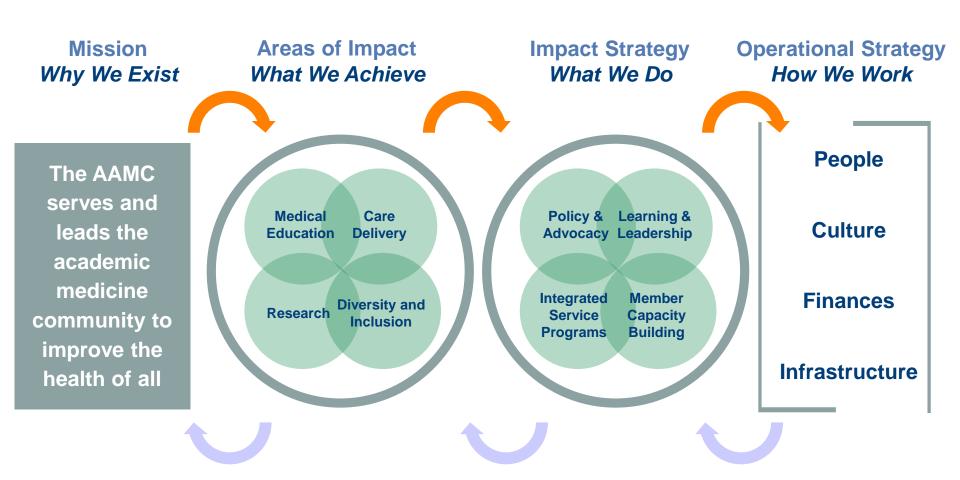
# Academic Societies

# AAMC Research on Care Community

#### **ROCC member survey** (September 2014)

- 325 individual members from 151 institutions representing vice/assoc. deans, CMOs/VPs, chairs, and professors.
- 90% ROCC members current engaged in a collaborative research project with CLINICAL colleagues.
- 67% ROCC members currently engaged in a collaborative research project with TEACHING faculty.

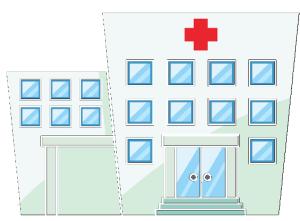

# Learning Health System Champion and Pioneer Award

- The AAMC Learning Health System Challenge and Planning Award recognizes systematic efforts that enhance research activity and collaboration.
- Each **Champion Award** winner receives a \$5,000 prize.
- Champions represent best practice in research, health system, and education collaboration
- Each **Pioneer Award** receives \$10,000 to develop a grant to study the implementation of a systematic change that enhances research.
- In addition to the awards, travel support is provided to allow for face to face learning between challenge and planning awardees.

### Clinical Research Database

- Large-scale, de-identified clinical data structured to support a wide range of clinical analytics
- CRDB accessible via web app for casual users (e.g., faculty, housestaff and students) and via a number of tools for advanced users (e.g., analysts, bioinformatics staff, etc.)
- Connection to IRB submission system for access to identified data
- Data from Epic/IDX: 2007 -2013
- 2 million patients; 7.5 m patient encounters; 20 m Lab / Rad procedures; 36 m prescriptions; 1 b vitals / physician findings



### Community Engagement Studio

- Structured sessions that engages patients, consumers, and other non-academic stakeholders appropriate to the need
- Standing community engagement capability for a wide array of community interactions.
- Guided approach for both the community and researchers (coaching)
- Established approaches to engage patients/community members in different stages of research consultation and reduce barriers to participation
- Previous studios have focused on design, recruitment, dissemination, implementation, and consent
- Used in PCORI award



# Learning system linking clinical quality improvement, maintenance of certification, and research

- UW Health became a MOC Portfolio Sponsor and can provide MOC Part IV to faculty completing high quality improvement work on behalf of 18 participating Boards
- Physicians enroll through the UW Health MOC web site in organization-wide improvement projects (through QI registry)
- Quality improvement team provides education and training in improvement science
- Quality improvement team works with frontline care teams, ensuring high quality improvement work benefiting physicians working on Maintenance of Certification Part IV
- Also developed QI publishing resources, analysis and manuscript preparation assistance



# AAMC Research on Care Community

#### **AAMC Learning Health System Research Awards**

The 13 institutions have so far:

- Submitted 7 grant applications
- Been awarded 3 grants (PCORI, AHRQ, Medscape)
- Submitted 4 manuscripts for publication
- Published 4 manuscripts
- Delivered 31 presentations about their work
- Transferred knowledge and expertise to 30 institutions in a peer-to-peer learning exchange
- Six institutions have developed implementation plans
