




Racial Disparities A New Form of Mass Incarceration

African American Men represent 74% of Unlawful Use of Weapon (UUW) Class Four Felony cases in Illinois.




UUW Charges among Chicago Communities








Theme: Reason For Carrying

Sub-Theme: Protection

Patrick; 30; Working in Retail.

"I got shot before. And it kind of gave me a little anxiety, a little PTSD. You know what I'm saying? I just didn't want that to happen again. Rather safe then sorry."

Somebody put the gun out on me like, almost a block away from my house. I was walking, from my house to the bus stop. I called the police and they told me they not coming out."



Next Steps



First Time Weapon Offender Program.



Expand programming in new jurisdictions.



Increase enrollment of moderate and high-risk offenders



Enhance data collection of participants.



Simulated virtual reality scenarios to enhance skill acquisition.

Research Strategy



Quasi-experiment

Utilizing a quasi-experimental design to inform and enhance program development.



Randomized Control Trial

Once the program design is complete, begin evaluating the feasibility of a randomized controlled trial (RCT) model.



Qualitative

Exploratory analysis of participants and contributing factors to improve program design.



Latent Curve Modeling

Utilizing data to develop a risk assessment tool for predicting individuals more likely to recidivate for gun offenses.
