Background:

The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine Committee on the Public Health Consequences of Changes in the Cannabis Policy Landscape will host a public information gathering session for the committee's second full meeting. This session will feature presentations and panel discussions on cannabis regulatory models, how those models have influenced the cannabis marketplace and product availability, and how policies at various levels (federal, state, and local) influence the supply or demand side of the market. The committee will also hear from experts on how the cannabis industry approaches the wide variation in cannabis policy across local, state, and federal governments and from how U.S. regulatory bodies can learn from policies being implemented in other countries.

Objectives:

The committee will learn from experts how cannabis policies at the local, state, and federal levels affect the supply and demand sides of the market and public health. Key questions that will be covered throughout the meeting are:

- How do cannabis policies at the local, state, and federal levels affect the supply and demand sides of the market and public health?
- What are the perspectives of federal, state, and local organizations on the changing landscape of cannabis policy?
- What are the unanticipated consequences of early cannabis policies, and how can we learn from them to improve safety and minimize negative public health consequences?
- What surveillance and regulatory systems exist for cannabis, and how have they influenced the industry and public health?
- How does the cannabis industry approach the variation in cannabis policy across local, state, and federal authorities?
- What can federal, state, and local governments learn from other countries about cannabis policy?
