OUR PERSPECTIVES ON UNMET RESEARCH NEEDS



- Prevention: With the growing population of older adults in the United states and globally, strategies that reduce the risk of becoming injured need to be developed.
- Diagnosis: and diagnostic tools and treatments that may benefit this group need to be explored.
- Prognosis: Prognostic tools for risk stratification of TBI patients are limited in the early stages of injury in the emergency setting for TBI.
- Management: Early and comprehensive management of our seniors following a mild TBI can provide them with the best possible quality of life.
- TBI across the lifespan: Older adults with a TBI from earlier in life, warrant a focused approach to scientific study and treatment that is informed by, yet distinct from, that of TBI in disparate populations






WHEN ENTERING A ROOM WITH AN OLDER ADULT WITH TBI

- 1. Consider harsh lights and loud noise.
- 2. Handshakes.
- 3. Eye contact.
- 4. Listen, repeat, respond.
- 5. When listening, address distress
- 6. Give breaks.
- 7. Write it down.
- 8. Before ending, check for understanding.





CLO SING THOUGHTS

OLDER ADULTS SHOULD NOT BE LEFT BEHIND

- People matter! From a child who takes their first breathe to an older adult who takes their last breath.
- Older adults with TBI deserve the same advocacy and focused study as sports, military-related, and pediatric TBI.
- As individualized medicine and precision medicine continue to be heralded as the path forward, as "one-size-fits-all" approach to the conceptualization, diagnosis, and management of TBI in older adults will be viewed as increasingly antiquated and unacceptable.
