3 PHCRP POINTS

- Racism undergirds the very structure of society and therefore is a fundamental cause of health inequities.
- Race & ethnicity are social constructs that emerge out of a society's historical and contemporary socio-political structures.
- Racial and ethnic groupings do not exist outside of racism nor are they antecedent to it. They are products of racialization, i.e., the myriad of processes and mechanisms by which structural forces:
 - 1. organize people into hierarchized groups based on the power interests of a dominant group;
 - 2. imbue the groups with meanings derived from racializing frames established by a dominant group based on its interests; and,
 - 3. exert social and political power to maintain the boundaries between the dominant and other Racialized groups

Racism: antecedent to race (and the relational dimension of ethnicity)





2-DIMENSIONAL ETHNICITY CONSTRUCT

a 2 dimensions

- Attributional
- Relational



Racism: the relational link between race and ethnicity

- Intersectional relationship between race and ethnicity
- Ethnically identified groups experience racism
- Ethnicity does not exist outside of racism



ISSUE	RECOMMENDATION
Lack of clarity on race, ethnicity & racism	 Rely on extant PHCRP antiracism lexicon¹ and racism glossaries².
An ironic lack of rigor	 Assess race, ethnicity and racism-related constructs using approaches validated in the appropriate population(s)
Extensive measurement of race & ethnicity	 Account for potential harms of measures Compare novel methods with those previously critiqued as racist
Racism & white supremacy in epidemiology	 Diversify the profession to incorporate fresh perspectives Acknowledge the limits of one's own expertise
