- Total # applicants declined 1.2%
- First-time applicants increased by 2.3%
- Black/AA up 2.8%
- Hispanic/Latino/SO up 2.2%
- AIAN declined by 15.4%
- Women comprised the majority of applicants (last 7 years) – increased slightly from 56.6% to 56.8%
- LSES declined from 23.9% to 23.6%

- Total # applicants declined 1.2%
- First-time applicants increased by 2.3%

- First-year matriculants grew 0.8%
- Matriculants from all URiM groups declined
 - AIAN declined by 22.1%
 - Black/AA declined by 11.6%
 - Hispanic/Latino/SO declined by 10.8%
 - NHPI declined by 4.3%
- Women comprised the majority of matriculants (last 8 years) declined slightly from 55.4% to 55.1%
- LSES declined from 21.3% to 20.7%

Summary

- Total number of applicants in 2024-2025 declined
- Black/African American applicants increased by 2.8%
 - Decreasing trend continues in total Black/African American applicants since 2021-2022
- Effective practices exemplified by those undergraduate colleges/universities that have 50 or more Black/African American students applying to medical schools
- Matriculants from all URIM groups have declined
 - Staggering and continued decline in Black/African American matriculants since 2021-2022 through 2024-2025
 - Will the noted trend worsen given the anti-DEI push?
