
### Low-Income Fare Trial (LIFT)

#### What we did

- Randomized evaluation of discounts on bus and rail for low-income DC residents
- Three groups: free, unlimited trips vs. halfprice discount vs. no discount
- Measured impact on mobility and well-being
- Provided implementation insights for regional Metro Lift program

#### **Key Findings**

- Both half-price and free, unlimited trips:
  - Increased ridership
  - Reduced transportation insecurity
  - o Improved overall well-being
- Discounts shifted participants into higher-use patterns of ridership
- Even with discounts, not everyone used their cards





Where someone thinks they are in relation to their best possible and worst possible lift







## Lessons on policymaking timelines

- Metro's Lift program provides 50% off Metrobus and Metrorail trips for SNAP-eligible customers in DC, MD, and VA
- It was developed while the DC LIFT pilot was in progress; launching in June 2023
- The pilot provided key insights about
  - Target population and their preferences
  - Program design
  - Budget and staffing needs
- Results on its impact can continue to inform Metro Lift's evolution
