- Serve clients age 3 through adulthood (current capacity 50 clients)
- Maintain Colorado Daycare and Day-treatment licenses
- Comply with Practice Guidelines (Council of Autism Service Providers, ABA Treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorder)
- Provide Comprehensive ABA services and Home and Community Based Services (Medicaid Waiver)
- Four Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs), all line staff are Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs)
- Accept all private, state, federal insurance (Anthem, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Cigna, United Healthcare, Aetna)
- Colorado Medicaid
- TRICARE and CHAMPVA



- 2005 Alpine Autism Center opens October, ABA based day program
- 2007 First TRICARE clients (only BCBA billable, ECHO)
- 2008 First provider in region under Autism Services Demonstration
- 2010 Colorado Insurance Mandate for Applied Behavior Analysis
- 2011 New Facility, First adult clients
- 2013 Operations threatened during TriWest/United Healthcare transition
- 2014 Autism Care Demonstration Begins (all ABA under one uniform program)
- 2015 Colorado moves ABA from waiver to medical service under Medicaid (per 7 July 2014 CMS Info Bulletin)
- 2020 Operations threatened during TRICARE/Healthnet Audit
- 2021 Deferred any new TRICARE clients due to issues with authorization and March 2021 Autism Care Demonstration Comprehensive Revisions
- 2023 Began serving new TRICARE clients again



- Autism diagnosis must be re-certified by a diagnosing provider every two years (DSM-5 Diagnostic Checklist); children over 8 must be diagnosed by specialist
- Outcome measures:
 - Pervasive Developmental Disorder Behavior Inventory (PDDBI) completed by parents and providers every 6 months
 - Social Responsiveness Scale (SRS-2) completed initially/annually
 - Vineland 3 completed initially/annually
 - Parenting Stress Index (PSI-4) or Stress Index for Parents of Adolescents (SIPA) completed every 6 months
- Exclusion of ABA services in school settings by Behavior Technicians
- Restrictions on services in community settings and activities of daily living
- Exclusion of services for educational or vocational goals
- Minimum of six parent/caregiver training sessions each 6 months

- TRICARE Autism Care Demonstration benefits are by far the most difficult and administratively burdensome to deliver (of all carriers, including Medicaid)
- March 2021 changes to the ACD have been detrimental to families and providers access to care/military readiness has been NEGATIVELY impacted
- Progress of clients is inherent in ABA service delivery; objective attainment dwarfs all other available services (speech, PT/OT, special education)
- For profound autism, consideration needs to be made for maintaining functioning level and prevention of regression (more research needed)
- An autism diagnosis within a family is usually traumatic, exhausting, emotionally and financially devastating (Military Readiness Impacted)
- It would be refreshing to see DHA actually trying to help families, improve military readiness and quality of life
