Stephen W. Barthold (IOM), DVM, PhD, Distinguished Professor of Veterinary and Medical Pathology, University of California, Davis. Dr. Barthold received his BS and DVM from UC Davis and his PhD from the University of Wisconsin. He became an IOM member in 2001.
