This template helps guide airport leaders in managing its messaging of disclosures, stakeholder communications, and reporting that may be required after a contingency event or in anticipation of such an event. It is designed to answer the question "How do we make sure we are communicating effectively and accurately to our constituencies throughout the incident action lifecycle?"

If a contingency plan is being used to guide an airport's actions and the need arises to communicate either inwards or outwards, use this template as a plan insert or attachment. Not all communications tools listed may pertain at your airport or in the situation triggering use of the contingency plan.

## Instructions:

- 1. For each type of contingency plan, complete and insert (or attach) this template at each place in the plan that requires (whether by policy, best practice, or legal/regulatory requirement) formal internal or outward communication.
- 2. Communications tools that your airport does not use may be deleted.
- 3. When coordinating communications around contingencies with municipal and county jurisdictions, be sure that your communications templates are synchronized with government spokespersons.
